Long-Term Care Ombudsmen advocate for people who live in long-term care settings, working to resolve problems related to the health, safety, welfare, and rights of residents. This vulnerable population needs people who will:

- Demonstrate empathy to residents, who are often living with dementia and/or physical challenges,
- Educate residents on their rights as spelled out in the Ohio Revised Code,
- Empower residents to speak up for excellence in their care,
- Problem-solve to find a solution for the resident's issue, and
- Negotiate a resolution, working in partnership with the key staff members of the nursing, assisted living or group home.

If you excel at building rapport with seniors, time management, problem solving, and find it rewarding to help those who need a voice, this job is for you.

Successful candidates will receive 100 hours of state training under the Ohio Department of Aging and the Office of Ohio State Long-Term Care Ombudsman, pass a certification exam, and hold the certification of Long-Term Care Ombudsman Specialist.
